# Language Requirement (18 credit hours)

\*Practicum (non-course requirement): Practicum experience approval is a prerequisite or corequisite for enrolling in LLC 4500.

Students will need to provide evidence of the practicum experience to the instructor to receive instructor approval to register. Includes study abroad (min. 5 weeks) where one of the target languages are spoken, or service learning/internship (one semester) in target language.
