Continuation Standards: Students must have a 2.00 grade point average (GPA) in all courses used to fulfill major requirements. Students who fall below the 2.0 GPA in major coursework will be placed on program probation. If a student's major GPA falls below a 2.00 for two consecutive semesters, the student will be eligible for dismissal from the major.

Program Policies: Political science majors may not count more than six credits of independent study (POLS 4980 Advanced Independent Study (1-6 cr)) and/or internship work toward the major. The two 4000-level seminars and the methods class must be completed at Saint Louis University, not by transfer credit. Only 15 credits of transfer credit can apply toward the political science major. Students may not count more than four 1000 level courses toward the major and must take at least four 3000 or 4000-level courses.

To be certified for graduation, a student is required to...

1. Complete no less than 120 credits, including 43 credits in the POLS-IR major;
2. Have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA, a 2.0 POLS-IR GPA, and a 2.0 GPA in the minor or 2nd major;
3. Complete 30 of the final 36 cr. at SLU;
4. Submit the on-line application for graduation at the beginning of the last semester of study.
