- 3) Discussion: Draft Core Instructor Eligibility Statement for HLC  
--Approved by UUCC with unanimous approval
  
- 4) Discussion: How can members of the UUCC assist in the work of increasing capacity for course proposals for and course delivery in key areas of the Core in advance of the launch year?  
Some areas of current concern: CORE 1000 (Ignite); CORE 1500 (CPI); CORE 1200 (EP2); CORE 1600 (UQ:Theo); CORE 2500 (CP2); CORE 4000 (Collab. IQ)
  - Discussion of efforts to expand teaching pool for EP2: SPAN 3020 counts (5-7) doubling of courses teaching; outreach to CPHSJ for Public Health Communication courses; possible other courses in health sciences that focus on communicating and visualizing health data.
  - ENGL 1900 / CORE 900 is always an issue year to year and the Core does not change this; one FA 21 section was full and cancelled due to no faculty to teach
  - Core budget does include funds for adjuncts that we can tap to fill in capacity last minute, but as many point out this may not help when we can't find adjuncts last minute. Only way to fix this problem long term is to hire more teaching faculty in certain areas.
  - CPI, 2 and 3 have a capacity issue as well; faculty and staff can both teach this so we need to be getting the word out and increasing interest in delivering these courses / experiences
  - Concern from UUCC rep from Doisy that no CP2 experiences or courses have been approved; we will need some of these in 2022-23
