4) AD review and reappointment procedure – approved

- July 1st of the 3rd year of their term the Associate Directors will inform the Director if they want to continue serving in their position. ADs can re-up for one additional term without an open call; after two consecutive terms they are free to reapply for additional terms.
- Regardless of whether they wish to be reappointed, in the fall of an ADs 3rd term, UCC members and subcommittee members will be asked to complete a feedback survey to offer observations and formative feedback. Survey will open Sept. 1 and close Sept 15 of each fall relevant.
